NJCAA UPDATES 2020-21 TIMELINE

START DATE: JANUARY 4

GAME DATE: JANUARY 22

The NJCAA updated the timeline for Men's & Women's Basketball on August 6, announcing Teams will be able to begin practice on Jan. 4. Competition will begin on Jan. 22, with a maximum of 22 regular season games. Championships will begin on April 19.

Teams will have the opportunity to practice for 60 consecutive days in the fall, with up to five scrimmages, between Sept. 15 through Dec. 15.

The NABC Championship Basketball Clinics were scheduled to be held across the country this spring in Chicago, Myrtle Beach, Springfield, Mass., Nashville and Las Vegas. All events were forced to cancel due to the coronavirus pandemic.

With coaches stuck in their homes working remotely, the NABC, Championship Productions and Basketballcoach.com teamed up to provide an online platform for the clinics to continue. The NABC Championship Virtual Clinics took to Zoom to give coaches the opportunity to teach each other and learn from one another - all for free.

From the likes of John Calipari, Jay Bilas, Stan Van Gundy and dozens of others, the clinics have continued daily into the month of June and will well into July.

Two NJCAA coaches are currently slated to be featured on the Webinar during the month of July. Bill Beilein of Niagara County (N.Y.) and Joe Kuhn of Joliet (Ill.) will have the opportunity to present.

On July 10, Beilein will delve into the 2-Guard Offense and on July 21, Kuhn will discuss how to build offensive efficiency into your system.



MOORE TAKES OVER AT MESABI RANGE

In May, Tamara Moore was hired to lead the Mesabi Range (N.D.) men's basketball program. With that, she became the only female head coach of a men's collegiate program in the country and just the second woman ever following Kerri-Ann McTiernan who coached CUNY-Kingsborough from 1995-2000.

Moore's resume is accomplished as a player; a high-school All-American, All-Big 10 performer at the University of Wisconsin, and the 15th overall pick of the 2002 WNBA.

"Soaking in all the knowledge of the (WNBA) opportunity got me here," Moore said. "I got to be coached by numerous head coaches that I got to learn different things from."

"I've never been doubted about my coaching ability. I just think it's all about opportunity. The message, with my hiring, is that the ceiling is now broken, and let's just take it even further."



FYRLERS WIN SECOND NJCAA TITLE



Sandhills (N.C.) defeated Mohawk Valley (N.Y.) 93-89 in the NJCAA Division III National Championship game in March to win their second title in program history.

Sandhills was led by Division III Player of the Year, Sayaun Dent, and freshman guard, Savion Staton. Dent, the 2020 Tournament MVP scored 27 points to lead all scorers, while Staton connected on four of seven three-pointers off the bench.

The Flyers and 10th-year coach Mike Apple were the top-seed heading into the tournament after being ranked No. 1 in the final 12 polls of the season. Sandhills finished with a record of 34-2 and won their final 18 games of the season.

Mohawk Valley, the No. 2 seed and seeking their first ever championship. They finished with a 30-3 record and the 2020 runner-up.

Held in Rochester, Minn. the NJCAA Division III Championship was the only men's basketball tournament completed this season due to the coronavirus pandemic.

BESS RETIRES AFTER 50 SEASONS

After a half-century of at the helm of the Three Rivers men's basketball program, Gene Bess has called it a career.

Bess arrived to Three Rivers in 1969 after a 12-year stint in the high school coaching ranks. After taking over head coaching duties two years later, Bess has since amassed a collegiate basketball-best 1,300 wins in his 50 years in charge of the Raiders' men's team. That's 143 more victories than Duke's Mike Krzyzewski and a whopping 373 more than the next leading all-time NJCAA men's coach, the late Bob Kirk, formerly of Allegany Maryland, who finished his career with a 927-158 record in 33 seasons. The most recent milestone for Bess came in the 2020 regular season finale on the court named in his honor.

In his career, Bess's teams reached the national tournament 17 times and amounted a 40-21 record. Three Rivers won two national titles (1979 & 1992) with two national runner-up finishes (1994 & 2010) under Bess's tenure.

Bess rattled off a streak of 83-straight wins on the Raiders home floor from 1978-1984. He tallied 16 30-plus win seasons over the course of his career, and just twice finishing a season with a losing record.

He coached plenty of players who went on to play professional, most notably, NBA All-Star Latrell Spreewell, who was on the 1992 National Championship team.

Brian Bess will assume the head coaching position at Three Rivers. For the past 27 years, Brian has been Coach Bess's assistant.

"I've been realizing the time was near for me to go," said Bess to Scott Borkgren of the Poplar Bluff Daily American Republic. "I felt like I was just as effective, but I didn't have the energy level to do what I need to do to excel as a coach – the time has come."

"I think it's time for him to get control and go for it," Gene Bess said of his son. "I think he'll do a great job."

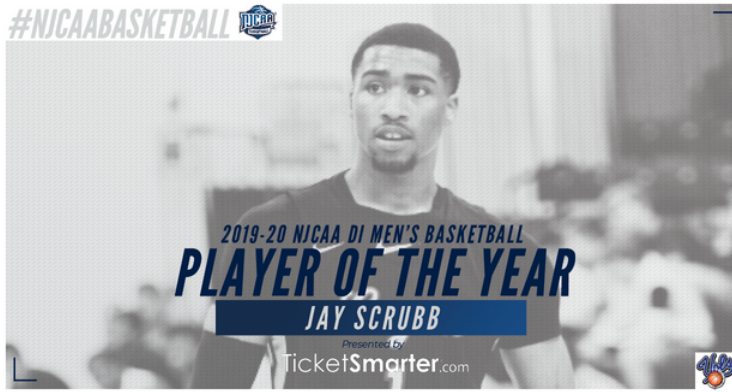

DIVISION I 2019-20 STATS: 21.9 PPG | 6.8 RPG | 2.7 APG



JAY SCRUBB - JOHN A. LOGAN (IL)



John A. Logan's (IL) Jayden Scrubb has been selected as the 2019-20 NJCAA DI Men's Basketball Player of the Year presented by TicketSmarter. Scrubb led the Vols to a 28-5 record this season, including an 18-0 mark in Region XXIV's Great Rivers Athletic Conference. The undefeated conference slate marks the first in Vols program history. John A. Logan ended the season on an 11-game win streak.

A dynamic scorer, Scrubb led John A. Logan in points per game and steals per game. Over the course of the season, Scrubb posted eight 30-point performances including a season-high 38 points on February 15 during a 93-83 win at Wabash Valley. Scrubb boasted an impressive performance in the Vols' NJCAA Central District final. The 36-point performance, with a 61.5 field goal percentage, and seven rebounds led to John A. Logan securing the third national tournament appearance in program history and a No. 5 overall seed.

COURTNEY CARTER - SOUTH SUBURBAN (IL)



South Suburban's Courtney Carter has been named the 2019-20 NJCAA Division II Men's Basketball Player of the Year presented by TicketSmarter.

A sophomore guard, Carter racked up an impressive stat-sheet; recording 15.7 points and 7.9 rebounds per game along with an NJCAA-best mark of 5.5 steals per game and a fourth-best mark of 7.9 assists per game. Carter helped guide South Suburban to a 29-4 overall record, concluding the season with a Region IV title before COVID-19 ended the Bulldogs' run for a national title.

DIVISION III 2019-20 STATS: 17.8 PPG | 8.0 RPG | 2.3 APG



SAYUAN DENT - SANDHILLS (NC)



The sophomore guard led the Flyers to capture their first NJCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championship since 2012. Winning three games in two days, the team claimed the program's second national title. Dent was instrumental in the championship win, adding 27-points to the final score. This performance earned Dent tournament MVP honors. Sandhills finished the season with a 34-2 record overall.

The NC native was a strong force for Sandhills all season, leading the Flyers to capture the second NJCAA Region X championship during his time at Sandhills. He also led the Flyers in three vital statistical categories - points per game, minutes played per game, and rebounds per game.

CHRIS ONEY - PEARL RIVER (TX)



Leading Pearl River (MS) to an undefeated 28-0 season, Chris Oney has garnered to coaching honors as the 2019-20 NJCAA DI Men's Basketball Coach of the Year presented by TicketSmarter. As the lone remaining undefeated DI team, the Wildcats earned a No. 1 seed in the national tournament. En route to earning Pearl River's second national tournament appearance in program history, the Wildcats claimed MACJC and NJCAA Gulf District titles. A tough defensive team, Oney's squad ranked second in the nation holding opponents to an average 60.4 points per game. Under Oney's guidance, two Wildcats earned All-America honors this year. Tae Hardy was named a First Team selection while Isaih Moore garnered Third Team recognition. Moore also received national player of the week recognition on March 4. Oney completed his fourth year as head coach at Pearl River, previously serving as an assistant coach from 2011-2015. Oney has coached the Wildcats program to a 91-18 record for an .834 winning percentage. Prior to his arrival in Poplarville, Oney served as an assistant coach at NCAA DI Grambling State in Grambling, LA for two seasons.



DIVISION III 2019-20 RECORD: 31-1 | NO. 1 SEED OF NJCAA DIVISION II NATIONAL TOURNAMENT

RANDY CASEY - MILWAUKEE AREA TECH (WI)



After compiling an impressive 31-1 mark this year, Milwaukee Area Tech head coach Randy Casey has been named as the 2019-20 NJCAA Division II Men's Basketball Coach of the Year presented by TicketSmarter. After holding down the No. 1 ranking since February 17th, Milwaukee Area Tech qualified for just its second-ever NJCAA tournament appearance right before the event's cancellation due to COVID-19. The Stormers entered as the No. 1 seed in the 16-team field after boasting an impressive resume; concluding the season a 24-game winning streak that included two wins over DI-ranked Triton as well as an N4C regular season championship and a Region IV championship to book a place to Danville. Milwaukee Area Tech finished with a perfect 12-0 home record while winning 25 of its 31 games by double digits. The high-flying Stormers averaged 102.5 points per game against a schedule completely composed of NJCAA members.



DIVISION III 2019-20 RECORD: 34-2 | 2020 DIVISION III NATIONAL CHAMPION

MIKE APPLE - SANDHILLS (NC)



Mike Apple, head coach of the Sandhills (NC) Flyers, has been named the 2019-20 NJCAA Division III Men's Basketball Coach of the Year presented by TicketSmarter. In his 10th season heading the Sandhills' men's basketball program, Apple led the top-seeded Flyers to capture their first NJCAA Division III Men's Basketball Championship title since 2012. Both titles have come under Apple's helm and this season marked the best in program history. With an overall record of 34-2, the Flyers completed the season with 18 consecutive wins. Averaging a nation-leading 103.6 points per game this season, The Flyers held opponents to 74.7 points and were ranked No. 1 in the final 12 regular season NJCAA polls. Apple's coaching success throughout the 2019-20 campaign led to sophomore guard Sayaun Dent's recognition as a First Team All-America honoree. The Moore county native was named head coach in 2011 and since taking over, has coached the team to an overall record of 121-42.
